George Buckman Fells
 George Buckman Fells, eldest son of Stephen and Mary Ann O'Brien Fells, was born September 15, 1862, in the Falls neighborhood. His early education was obtained in the district school and the village school; later he attended Lewisburg, New York, High School, where he graduated with honors. After leaving home he entered the Henry S. Washburn law office, remaining until the spring of 1885, when he came west with his parents. He is now in business in Kansas taking up as a claim in what was once a vast domain. In 1885 Mr. Fells and his wife moved to Kansas where he remained for a short time. Following this he returned to the Falls neighborhood where he remained until the death of his father. Mr. Fells served the town very ably for many years during the last half of his life. Early in 1898 he returned to the Falls neighborhood where he remained for some time. He was then elected to the office of town clerk and served in that capacity for several years. He was also elected to the office of justice of the peace and served in that capacity for several years. In February, 1921 he suffered a stroke which resulted in his death. He was buried in the Falls cemetery. He was a member of the County Association.
