Two students, Martha Gorton and Lisa Raymond, consider some of the changes that have taken place at MCS this year.




Many students began school in September in classrooms with unpainted walls and windows covered with plastic.





To this auspicious career he will then devote his life. ... Guillermo






We had plenty of activities going on through out the week. Friday night at the pep rally there were lots of students and parents who participated to show their support.








# A Hard Struggle .....







The Morris Mustangs J.V. basketball team coached by Sonny Benjamin, was very inexperienced this year and despite their losing record, kept on trying in every game.



The girls had a great time and look forward to a good season again next year.





They are supervised by Mrs. Russel, who is also the health teacher at M.C.S.




















# Senior Play
