
















M.C.S. is a Place to Learn

In our classes we are learning new and interesting things every day. We discover our interests in many areas; drama, computers, foreign languages, science and many others. We even had our own archeological dig!




















Most of all, she seemed to really like us and believe in us and, in turn, was loved by all.

The classrooms, though, here at M.C.S. gave us the access to all the other places. At times, we hated that one room, and the next day we loved it.




Today is moving so fast that we hardly have time to think about tomorrow. But, we do think about our dreams, fears and hopes. We know that there is a world out there just waiting for us.
