The struggle became less than we anticipated. It was just a day to day, simple accomplishment. Some of us reached for stars far from us,

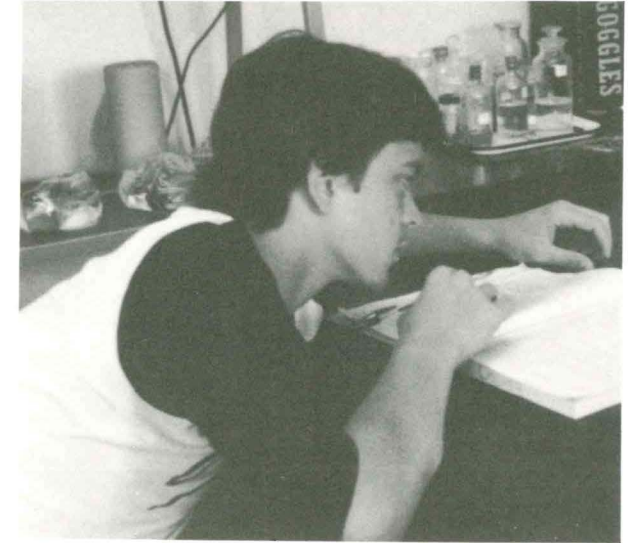
and success was ours. For some, we reached a goal that would lead to the stars, just one step at a time, and we knew success. Whatever our dream, we kept it.

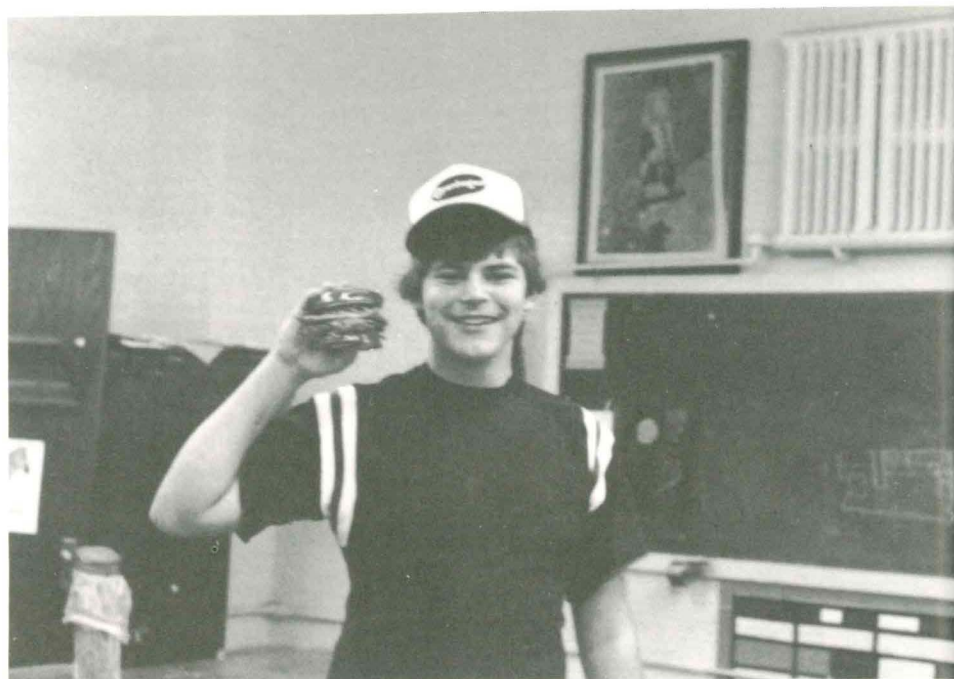
# THE PLACES WE'VE BEEN

The classrooms, though, here at M.C.S. gave us the access to all the other places. At times, we hated that one room, and the next day we loved it.

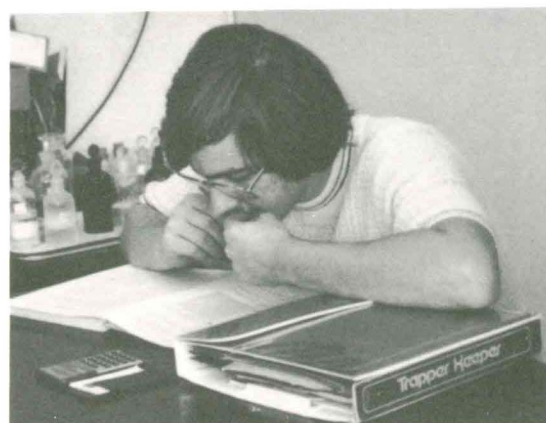

# A PLACE AWAY FROM HOME

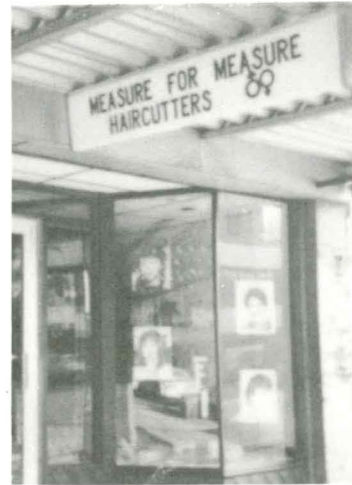
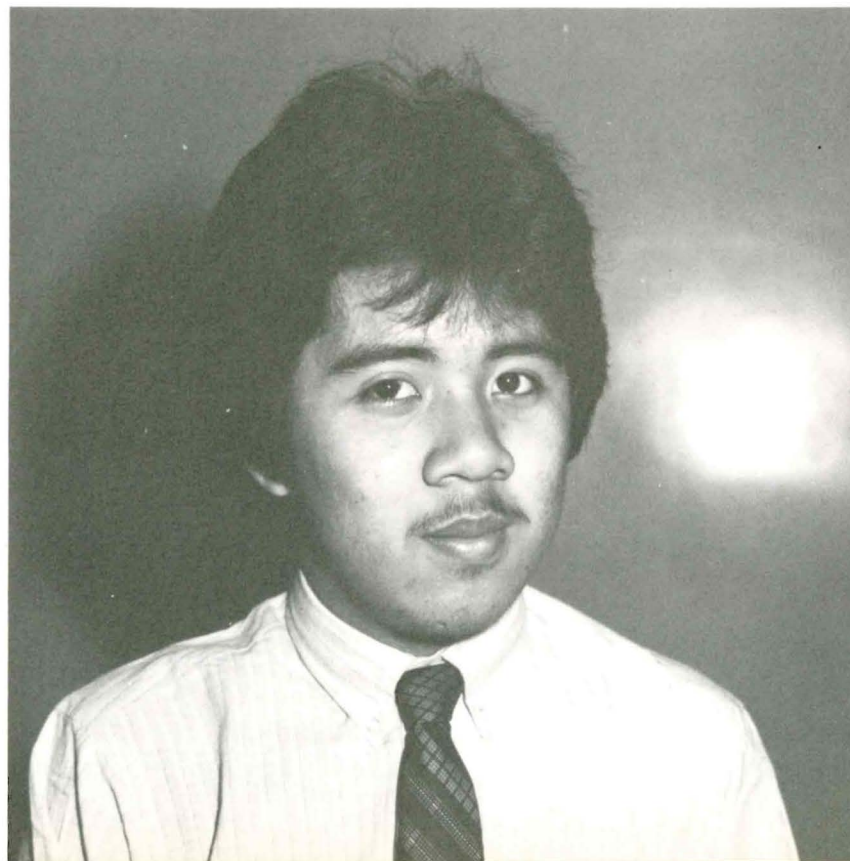
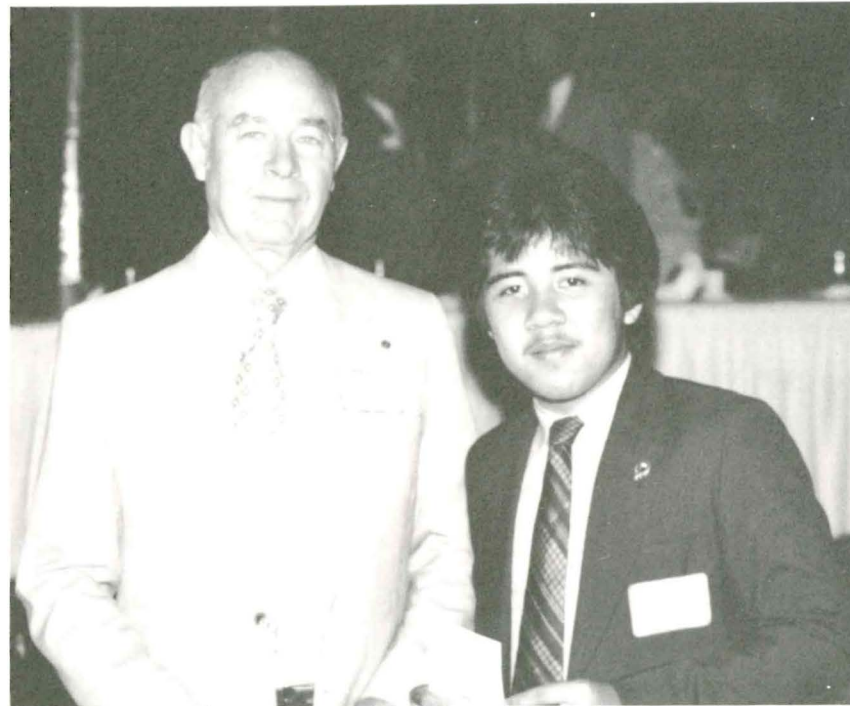
