Queen and King. Matt and Karen were the 1989 Senior Prom King and Queen. The prom theme was "Black Tie Affair."

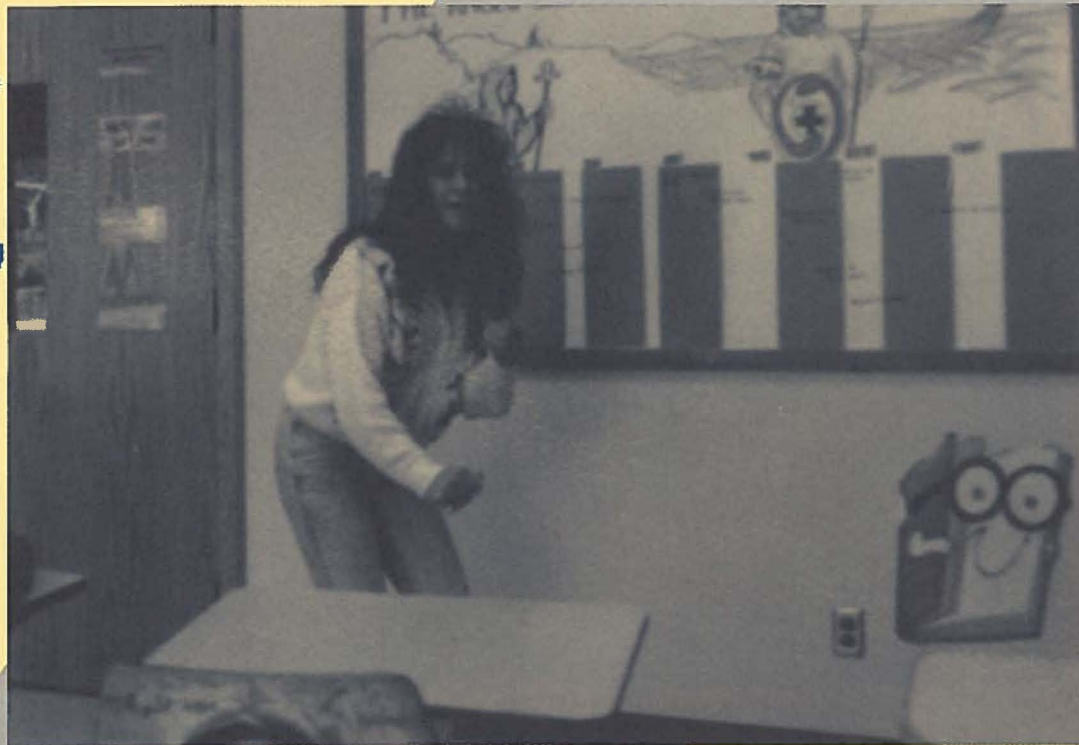

Toot! Toot! The fourth grade entertains parents and friends at moving up time with the recorder music they've practiced all year.

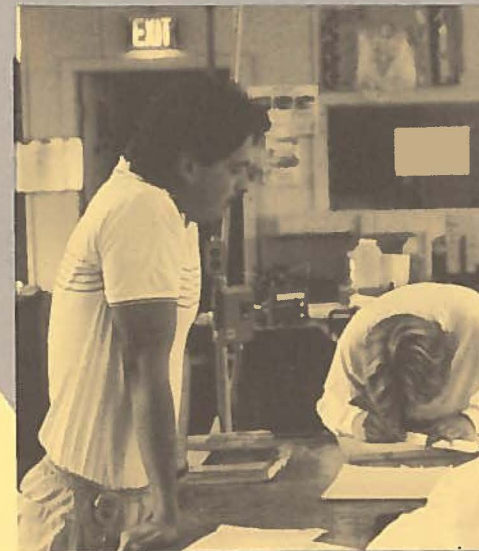
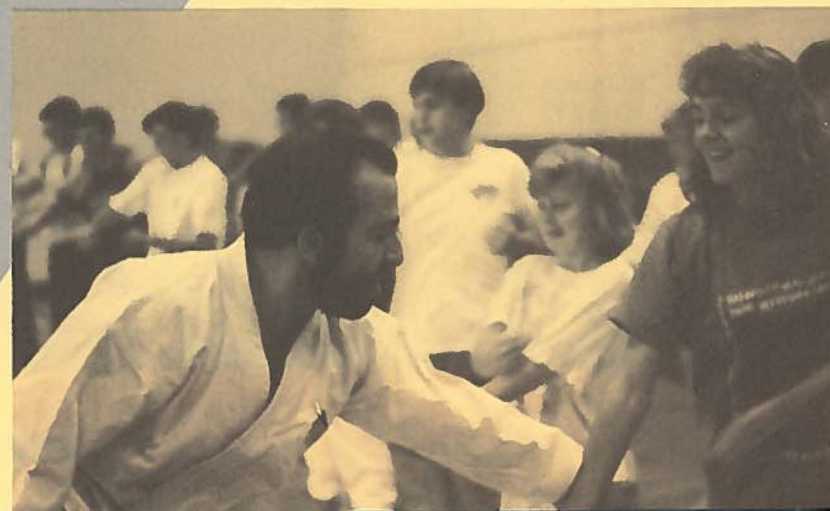

The Karate Kid This year the junior gym classes featured a unit on Karate. This unit was met with mixed emotions.



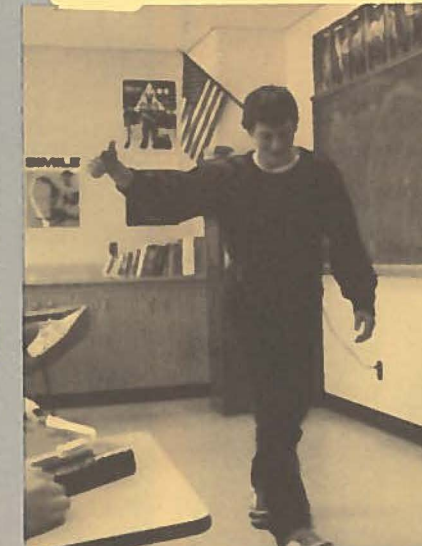

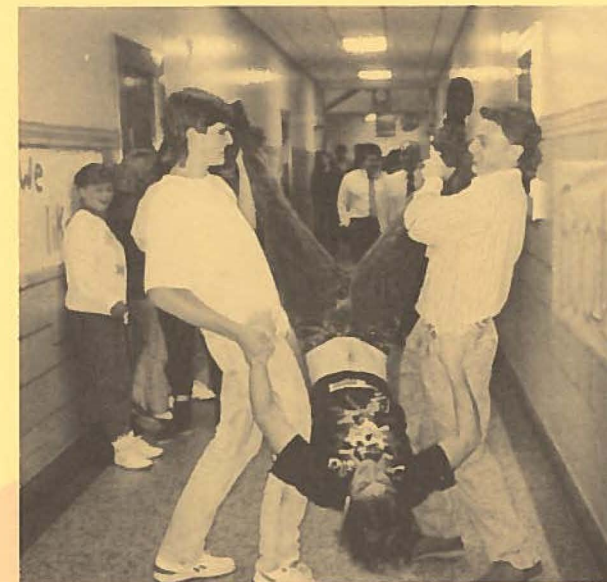

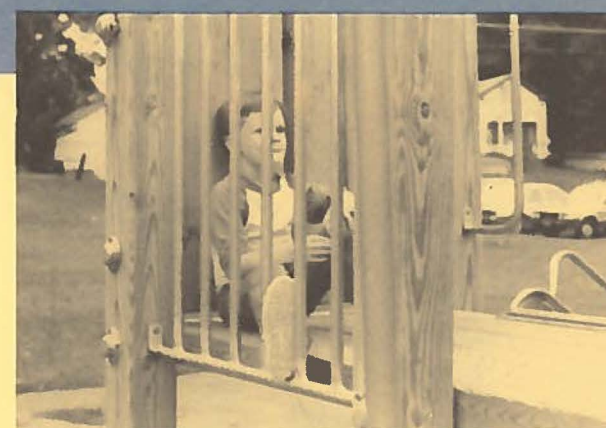

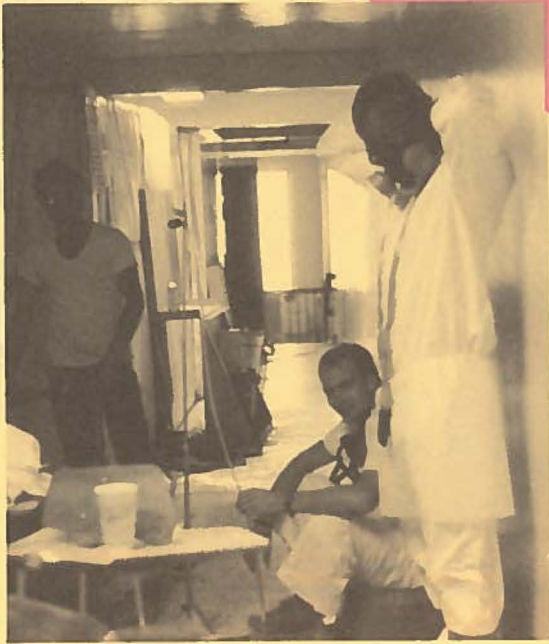
LOCKERS AND HALLS

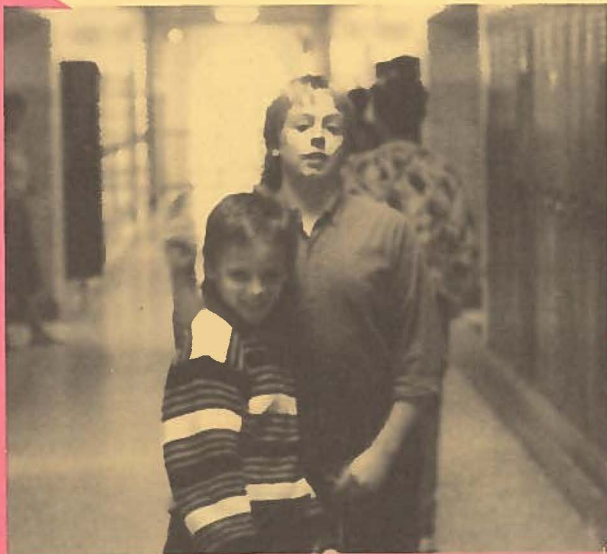

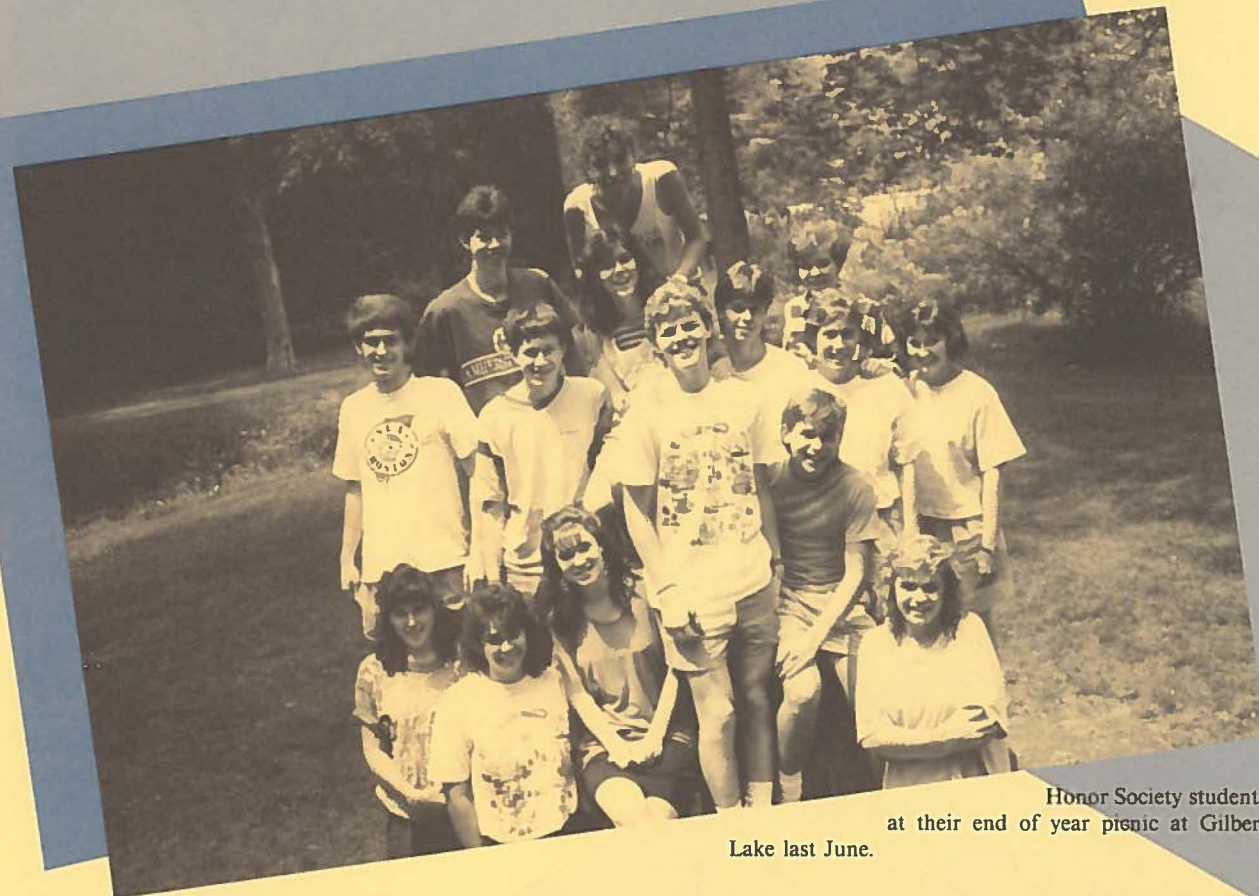

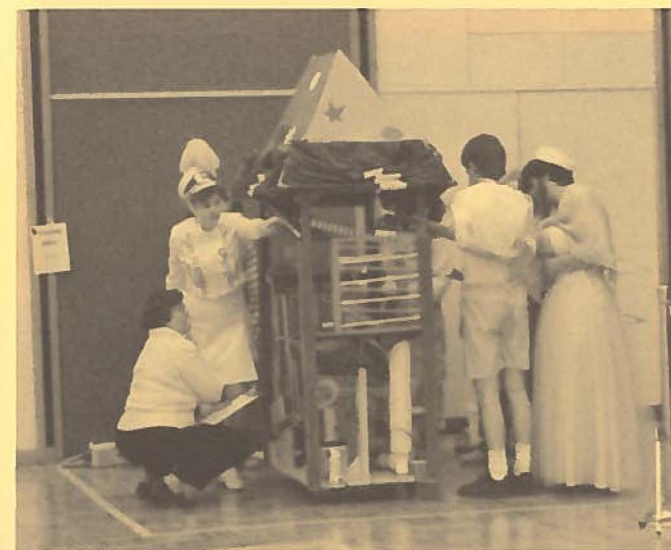

at the Beginning**

This year, the kindergarten program has been improved to help students grow developmentally and socially. The kindergarten/pre-first program is set up so that there are two, one half day programs of regular kindergarten taught by Mrs. Miller. The other kindergarten is taught by Mrs. Dixon, and these students need a boost educationally and socially as well as developmentally. This class allows these students who are not ready for regular kindergarten curriculum to develop at their own paces. Some students from these programs will be enrolled into the pre-first program. This program will, according to research, cut down on frustration, lower the need of remedial classes, and show better results on the PEP tests.

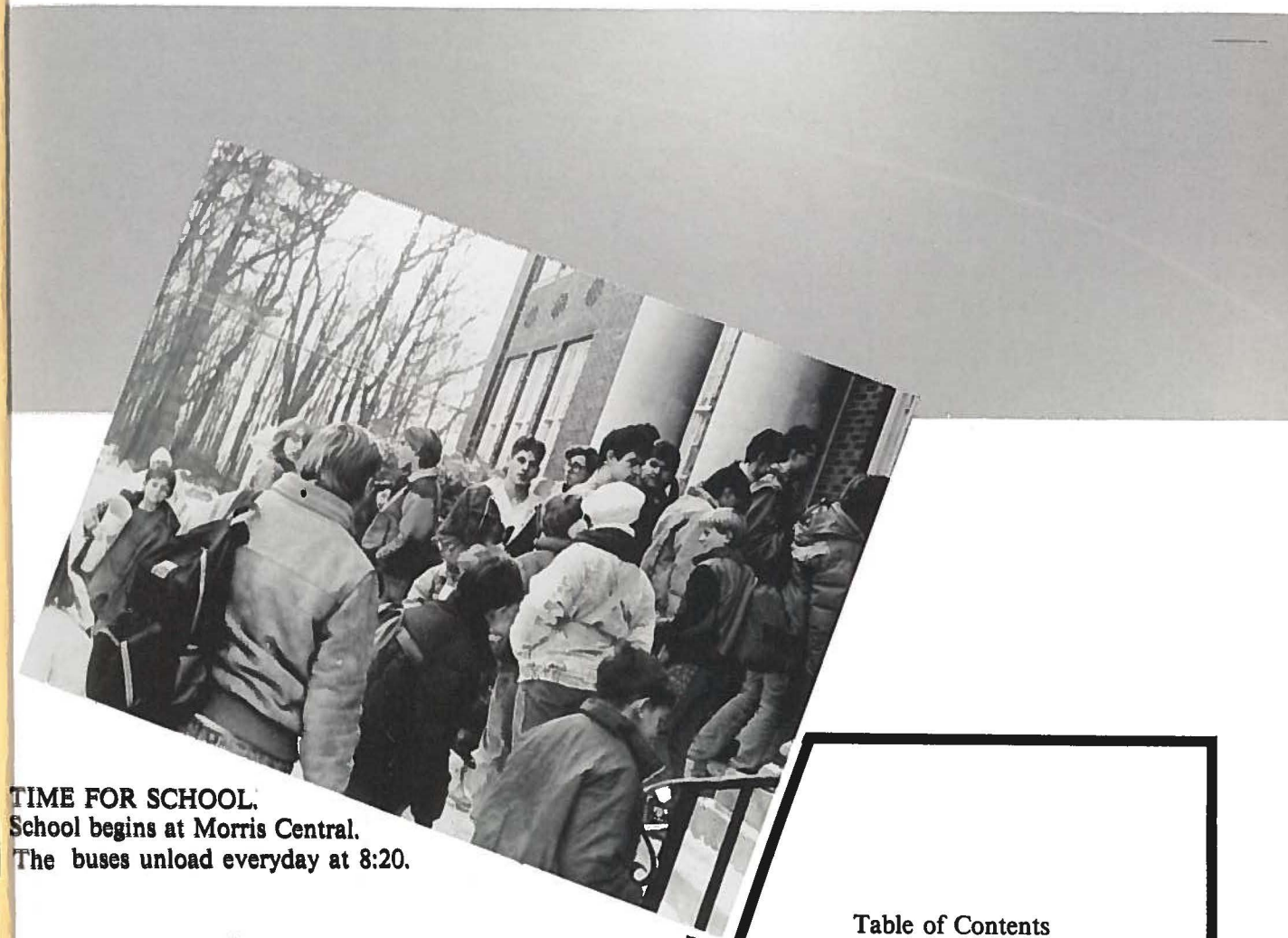
Our new program was modeled after programs in both Oxford and Sherburne-Earlville. As Mr. Hess says, "The teachers around here are the ones who are making this work."

Morris Central School, in the past few years, has been accumulating a number of computers and computer software. Altogether Morris has about twenty computers.

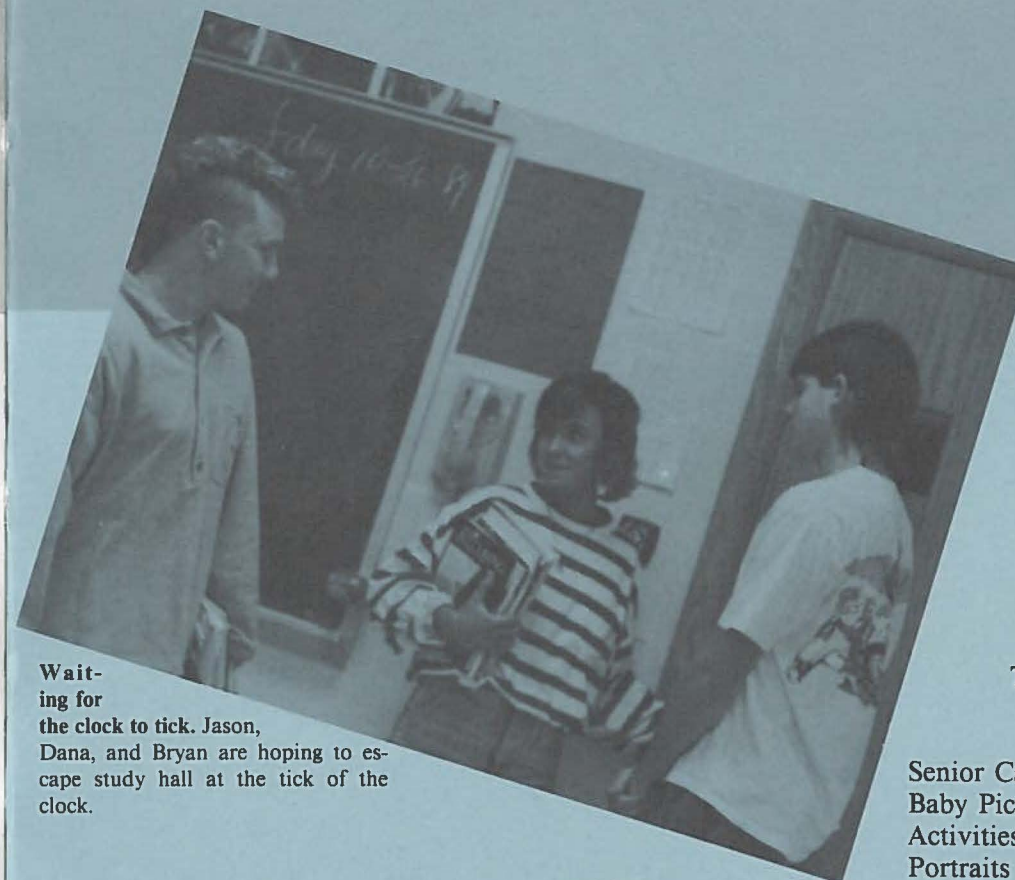
There are ten computers in the library and computer room combined. These computers are used for helping students in remedial math and reading, and they are also used for computer literacy and computer math. Mrs. Skoglund is in charge of the computer room.

Mr. Rosas, the business manager, uses a computer for keeping the business records of the school. The office uses another for attendance records and for producing the school correspondence.

The technology class has one for computer aided drafting and design (CADD). There is also one in Mrs. Harrington's room that is used by the journalism class for yearbook records.

Mrs. Kristofik has several computers used for her curriculum, and there are about three computers spread around in the elementary classes. These are so the students can become familiar with computers. Everyone in Morris takes advantage of the computers available to us.

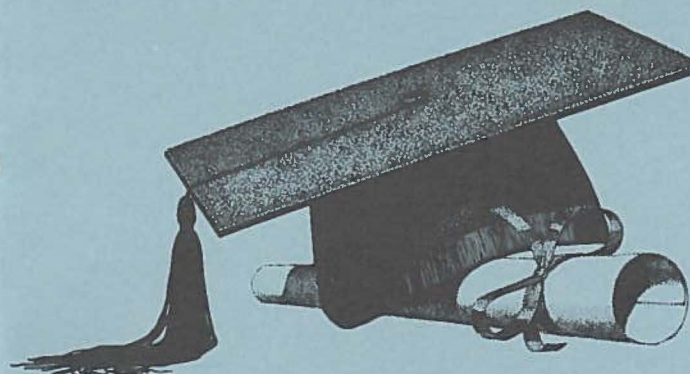

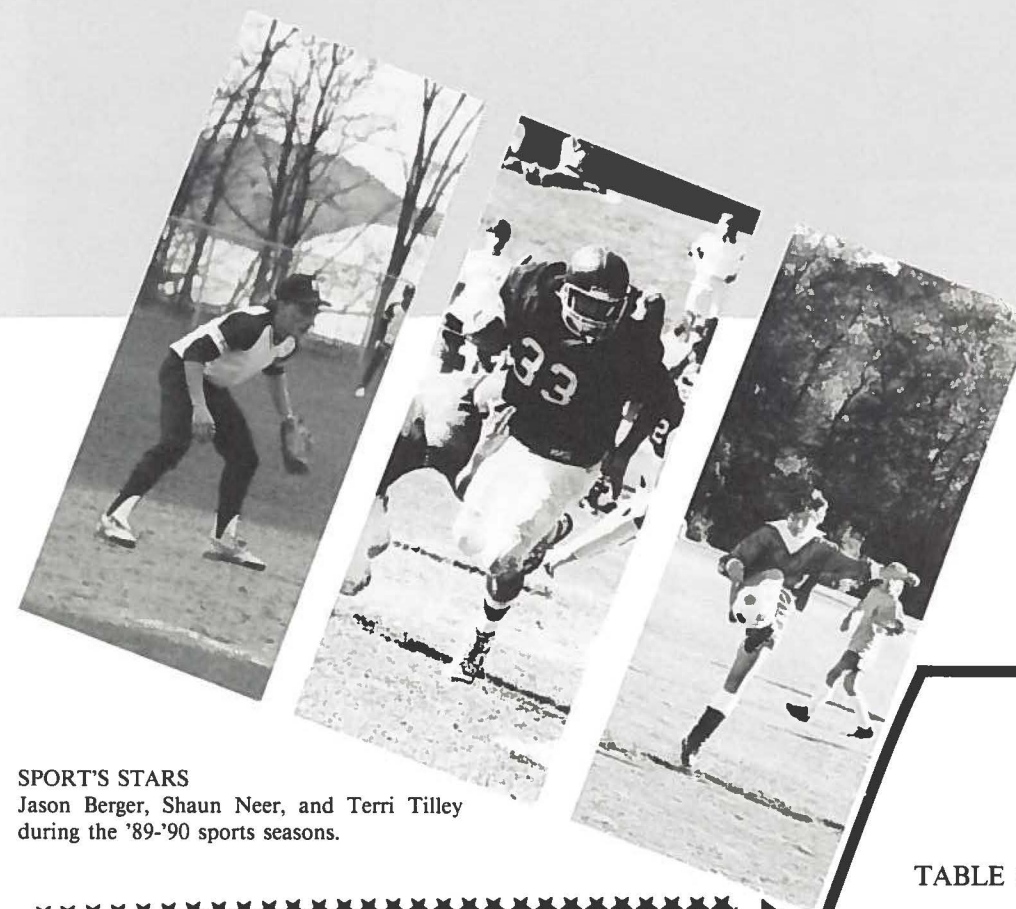
"We hope we were successful in letting these people know the dangers of smoking," Mrs. Russell said. "We requested that the students take the information home to their parents who smoke."
