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Three Stannard Men of Connecticut and Massachusetts

Claudius Stannard, fourth great-grandfather of the author, was born in Suffield, Hartford County, Connecticut, on 12 September 1764, the ninth child and sixth son of John Stannard Jr. and his wife Hannah (Hanchett) Stannard.^[1] Suffield, Hampshire County, Massachusetts, became Suffield, Hartford County, Connecticut, in May 1749.^[2] Thus when Hannah Hanchett and John Stannard Jr. were married in Suffield on 9 November 1748,^[3] they were in Hampshire County. Hannah⁴ (Hanchett) Stannard, born in Suffield, Massachusetts, 7 October 1728, was the daughter John³ Hanchett the 2nd,^[4] granddaughter of Deacon John² Hanchett and great-granddaughter of Thomas¹ Hanchett, one of the first settlers of Suffield.^[5]

John Stannard Jr., 1729/30–1773

John Stannard Jr., Hannah's husband, the son of John Stannard and his wife Eunice Crow, was born in Windsor, Hartford County, Connecticut on 24 February 1729/30.^[6] Also born in Windsor were John Jr.'s siblings, Mary Stannard on 24 September 1733 and Joseph Stannard on 20 March 1739/40.^[7] Their parents were married at the First Church in Hartford, Hartford County, Connecticut, on 30 May 1728.^[8] Eunice Crow, daughter of Thomas Crow, was baptized in the Hartford First Church on 15 July 1707; other children of Thomas Crow were also baptized in that church: Abigail on 21 March 1702; Christopher on 15 July 1705, and Asahel on 17 February 1711/12.^[9] John Stannard Jr. named his first child Hannah after his wife, his second child Eunice after his mother, and his fourth child, John, after himself and his father.^[10]

About nine months prior to John Stannard Jr.'s marriage, on 24 February 1748/49 (his nineteenth birthday), he purchased from Asaph Leavitt 18 acres of land in Suffield, then in Massachusetts, for £61 5s; the land was described as being "three-cornered" and adjoining land of John Hastings.^[11] John Jr. sold this same parcel of land to John Hastings on 29 July 1754.^[12] Between 6 January 1757 and 13 September 1762, John Stannard Jr. purchased two 4-acre parcels of land and parts of a 20-acre parcel in an area of Suffield known as Crooked Lane.^[13] On 23 March 1763 for £150, he sold these as two parcels, one of 24 acres and one of 4 acres, the latter with buildings, being the homestead on which John lived.^[14]

Major-General Phineas Lyman of Suffield commanded the First Company in the First Regiment from Connecticut in the French and Indian War; included in this company was “John Stanard,” corporal, who entered the company on 21 April 1755 and was discharged on 10 October 1755. It seems likely that this was John Stannard Jr., a resident of Suffield, who would have been about 25 years old. It is unlikely that this was John Jr.’s father John who would have been, say, about 48 to 55 years old.^[15]

Less than a year after his eleventh child, Chloe, was born in Suffield on 31 October 1769,^[16] John Stannard Jr. moved his family to New Marlborough, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, where, on 10 September 1770, he purchased from John Clark and James Foran for £50 a parcel of land containing 29 acres and bordering on the New Marlborough/Sheffield town line.^[17] John Stannard Jr. was listed in the 1771 Massachusetts Tax Valuation as a resident of New Marlborough; he was taxed on two rateable polls, one house with adjoining shop which was valued at ten shillings, one horse, two swine, one acre of pasture, three acres of tillage, and fifteen bushels of grain per year.^[18] After only about three years, John Jr. died in New Marlborough, probably sometime in October 1773, leaving his widow and children, the youngest, Chloe, being about four years old. On 1 November 1773 his widow Hannah asked the probate court of Berkshire County to appoint an administrator for her deceased husband’s estate.^[19] The inventory of John Jr.’s estate, dated 30 December 1773 and submitted to the court on 4 January 1774, included “8 shoe lasts,” “2 shoe hammers,” several “shoe knives,” supplies “to make women’s shoe heals” and “100 lbs of Leather,” all indicating that besides farming John Jr. worked as a cobbler. This inventory, which valued his estate at £275, 10s 6d, also included household items such as bedding, chairs, books, notes for funds owed to John and real estate of about 26 acres.^[20]

On 18 July 1780, “Widow Stanard,” presumably Hannah (Hanchett) Stannard, widow of John Jr., married Jared Huxley in New Marlborough, where both were residents.^[21] In Jared Huxley’s *Genealogical Descent of the Huxley Family in the United States*, he stated “2nd Jared [Huxley] married ___ Stanard; in the record she is called Widow Stanard, in 1780. There were no children by this marriage, and letters yet in existence show the marriage to have been very unfortunate and the cause of much trouble.”^[22] Part of the “trouble” may be indicated by the probate court case in which, on 21 July 1780, three days after Claudius’s mother married Jared Huxley, Obadiah Ward and John Stannard, brother of Claudius, posted a £2,000 bond so that Obadiah Ward became the guardian of “Claudeus Stannard a Minor Son to John Stannard late of New Marlborough...deceased....”^[23] Perhaps, Claudius was somehow at odds with Mr. Huxley and sought to distance himself from his

mother's new husband. About a month later, Claudius volunteered from New Marlborough to serve in the Revolutionary War in August 1780, although his sixteenth birthday on 12 September 1780, was only a month away.^[24]

John Stannard [Sr.], ca. 1700–after April 1789

Neither a birth date nor death date has been found for the John Stannard who married Eunice Crow in 1728/29 and fathered John, Mary, and Joseph in Windsor, Connecticut, between 1729/30 and 1739/40. Nor have the names of his parents been identified. Some have thought that he was the John Stannard, likely the son of Joseph and Hannah (Brackett) Stannard, born in Saybrook, Connecticut, on 24 August 1697,^[25] who married Rachel Conklin in Saybrook on 10 January 1721/22.^[26] This is impossible because John and Rachel (Conklin) Stannard were still having children as late as 30 October 1731 when their son Peter was born in Saybrook.^[27] Other speculation considered that John and Rachel (Conklin) Stannard's son John Jr., born in Saybrook on 8 October 1722,^[28] might be the John Stannard who married Eunice Crow. However, this is also impossible because that other John Jr. would have been about six years old when John [Sr.] and Eunice married in May 1728/29.

John Stannard [Sr.] married as his second wife Thankful Steel, possibly a widow, on 23 April 1747 in Suffield, Massachusetts, presumably after the death of his wife Eunice (Crow) Stannard.^[29] At that time John's three children were aged about 17, 13, and 7. Note that this John Stannard was "of Suffield" when he married in April 1747 and that his son John Jr. was "of Suffield" when he purchased land in Suffield on his birthday in February 1748/49. It seems fair to conclude that John [Sr.] moved his family to Suffield sometime after the birth of his third child in Windsor in March 1739/40 and before his second marriage in Suffield in April 1747. So far no deeds for John [Sr.] have been found for the purchase or sale of land in Suffield, Connecticut, or in Massachusetts. Nor have deeds with John [Sr.] as grantor or grantee been found in land record indexes for Middletown, Hartford, Wethersfield and Windsor, all in Connecticut.

A notice in the *Connecticut Courant* dated 8 June 1767 named a John Stannard as a creditor who owed money to Charles Granger of Suffield; John Stannard is described in this notice as "an absconded insolvent Debtor for more than Twenty Pounds Lawful Money."^[30] A warrant was issued on 26 May [1767] which was "directed to all Sheriffs and Constables, to attach, seize and keep all the Goods and Estate of the said John." Unless John made good on his debts three months after the date of the warrant "all the Estate so attached, will be sold for the Benefit of the Creditors of the said John."^[31]

Since this notice indicates that this John Stannard had left Suffield before 26 May 1767, the debtor was most likely John [Sr.], not John Jr. who was still living in Suffield in 1769.

The Asaph Leavitt of Suffield, from whom John Jr. purchased land in Suffield in February 1748/49, was the same Asaph Leavitt of Suffield who sold to John [Sr.], who was already “of Springfield,” on 20 May 1765 for £10, 5 acres of land in Springfield, Hampshire County [now Hampden County], located in the Agawam Society west of Joseph Stannard’s land.^[32] So two years before the creditor notice was published, John [Sr.] had “absconded” just across the Connecticut/Massachusetts border to the area directly north of Suffield which is now the city of Agawam in Hampden County. According to the Massachusetts Tax Valuation List of 1771, John Stannard, residing in Springfield, had one rateable poll and owned two cattle.^[33] Captain Asaph Leavitt died on 14 April 1774, most likely in Suffield where he is buried in the Old Center Cemetery.^[34] In Captain Leavitt’s will dated 17 November 1773, he gave “to John Stannard of Springfield Seven Acres and an half.”^[35]

On 17 April 1789, Joseph Stannard, yeoman of West Springfield, Hampshire County, son of John [Sr.], deeded for £45 received from Ashbel King, treasurer of Suffield and from “the rest of Inhabitants of Suffield” a parcel of land in West Springfield containing 30 acres, being bordered on the south by the highway from Worthington Sawmill to Westfield.^[36] The following provision was added to this deed:

Provided nevertheless that if the said Joseph Stannard and his heirs shall save the town of Suffield from all expenses and costs for the support and maintenance of John Stannard and Thankful Stannard his wife for the term of each of their lives agreeable to his bond to the Treasurer of the town of Suffield of even date then this deed to be Void otherwise Good in Law.

Clearly, John and Thankful Stannard were still living when this deed was executed by Joseph. It is fair to conclude from this deed that John and Thankful were residing in Suffield rather than West Springfield. Therefore, John [Sr.] died sometime after 17 April 1789. Suffield vital records to 1850 do not contain death records for John [Sr.] and Thankful. The 1790 census lists Joseph “Stonnard” as head of a household in West Springfield including three males aged 16 or over, one male under age 16, and five females.^[37] Thus John [Sr.] and wife Thankful may have been still living, residing with John’s son Joseph.^[38]

Joseph Stannard, 1739/40–after 7 April 1789

As noted above, Joseph Stannard, brother of John Stannard Jr., was born in Windsor, Connecticut, on 20 March 1739/40, son of John and Eunice (Crow) Stannard.^[39] About two weeks short of his twentieth birthday on 7 March 1759, he married in Suffield, Mercy Halladay,^[40] daughter of William Halladay. She was baptized in Suffield 7 March 1741/42.^[41] Their son Joseph, clearly their first child, was born four months after their marriage in Suffield on 8 July 1759.^[42] Almost six months before Joseph's father John [Sr.] purchased land in Springfield, on 6 November 1761, Joseph bought from William Worthington for £30 a parcel of land containing 12 acres in Springfield in Agawam Parish, which parcel bordered on land of Joseph Stannard "this day Capt. Leavit gave him a deed of."^[43] Joseph sold this same 12-acre parcel with a dwelling house on it, on 12 August 1767 for £37 10s to James Knap of Westfield.^[44] On 9 December 1767, James Knap of Suffield deeded to Joseph Stannard the same parcel for the full amount of £37 10s as a mortgage.^[45] Somehow Joseph regained possession of the same 12 acres with dwelling house and barn now in West Springfield and sold it for £40 to Mary Porter, wife of John Porter of West Springfield on 12 April 1781.^[46]

Joseph Stannard, residing in Springfield, was also included in the 1771 Massachusetts Tax Valuation list, with one rateable poll and owning one house with adjoining shop whose annual worth was £1 12s, one cattle, 4 acres of tillage and 3 acres of meadow. Per year the tillage produced twenty-eight bushels of grain and the meadow produced two tons of hay.^[47] Note that West Springfield was not set off as a separate town until 1774.^[48]

In Captain Leavitt's will dated 17 November 1773, he gave to "Joseph Stanard of Springfield Fifteen Pounds Money to be endorsed upon his Note I have against him or in case his Note should not be so much the residue to be paid in Grain."^[49] John Leavitt of Suffield (according to Asaph Leavitt's will Asaph's kinsman) sold to Joseph Stannard on 17 April 1789, 30 acres with a dwelling house in West Springfield located on the road from Worthington mill to Westfield,^[50] which is the same parcel Joseph had deeded to the treasurer of Suffield on the same day.^[51]

Joseph Stannard was enumerated in the 1790 census^[52] and, as Joseph Stannard, possibly in the 1800 census for West Springfield with one male aged 45 or older, two females aged 16 to 25 and one female aged 45 or older.^[53] It is a question whether the Joseph Stannard enumerated in the 1810 census is the same person or a younger Joseph, given that there was one male 45

or older, one male under 10 and one female 45 or older.^[54] The presence of a male under the age of ten may mean a grandson rather than a son is living with Joseph; it is likely that the female aged 45 or older is past the age of child-bearing. By the time of the 1820 census there was no Joseph Stannard in West Springfield. It is probably fair to assume that Joseph died before the 1820 census; in 1820 he would have been about 80 years old.

Two Nehemiah Daniels Families from Connecticut Part Three

5. NEHEMIAH⁵ DANIELS (*Nehemiah*⁴, *Thomas*³, *John*²⁻¹) was born in New London, Connecticut, 18 August 1763,^[1] died in Morris, Otsego County, N.Y., 21 August 1849, and was buried in the Quaker Burying Ground in Morris.^[2] He married (1) _____^[3] and (2) in New London 2 August 1794, ELIZABETH MALONY.^[4] She was born in New London 6 July 1776, daughter of William and Ann (Weeks) Malone [*sic*].^[5] She died 17 March 1853, and was buried with Nehemiah.^[6]

On 6 February 1833, Nehemiah Daniels, a resident of the Town of Butternuts in Otsego County, N.Y., aged sixty-nine, appeared before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in Otsego County and was deposed on his Revolutionary War service. He entered the service of the United States on or about the first of September 1779 at New London and also attested that he was born on 18 August 1763. Nehemiah Daniels was sixteen years old when he served in Captain Lee Lea's company in Colonel Levi Wells regiment for eight months. He stated that he was employed in building Fort Trumbull in New London and guarding the City of New London. Nehemiah deposed that he was never in any engagement.^[7]

There is a 1902 letter in the pension file from his great grandson, Edwin Dwight Northrup asserting that Nehemiah was one of the few survivors of the 1781 massacre at Fort Griswold in Groton and that his father, Nehemiah Daniels, Sr. was a deserter from the British Navy. Nehemiah Daniels's own deposition makes no claim of participating in the battle, and he is not one of the soldiers listed on the Fort Griswold memorial; there has been no evidence found that his father ever served in the British Navy.^[8] He further stated:

I lived in New London Town County of New London and State of Connecticut when called into service lived there about twenty three years after the close of the war than removed to the Town of Butternuts

County of Otsego and State of N.Y. where he has ever since resided and where he now resides....^[9]

The above information clearly shows that this Nehemiah Daniels never lived in Colchester or Hebron, Connecticut. Some genealogy publications and many online family trees have confused this individual with the Nehemiah Daniels, son of Nehemiah Daniels from Colchester and Hebron.^[10]

Elizabeth Daniels, widow of Nehemiah Daniels, a resident of Morris, Otsego County, N.Y. was seventy-three years old on 21 September 1849 when she was deposed for a widow's pension:

... she further declares that she was married to the said Nehemiah Daniels on the second day of August (1794) in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred ninety four in the Town and County of New London by the Revd. Zadock Darrow, that she has no family record of the marriage, the same having been destroyed, that she knows of no person living who was present at the wedding, and she knows of no Town or Church record, but supposes the marriage is recorded in the Town records of New London...


There was no civil record of their marriage found in New London. Zadock Darrow was an influential Baptist minister in New London and Waterford, but no record of marriages performed by Darrow has been located.^[11]

The following affidavit is in the pension file:

This is to certify that James Moore personally appeared before me and on his oath says that he was present and saw Nehemiah Daniels married to Elizabeth "Betsy" Malony on or about the year 1794.

Joseph Avery, Justice of the Peace

Dated at Waterford Sept. 26, 1849.



This is to certify that James Moore personally appeared before me and on his oath says that he was present and saw Nehemiah Daniels married to ^{Elizabeth} Malony on or about the year 1794
Dated at Waterford Sept. 26th 1849 } Joseph Avery Justice of the Peace

This proves that Nehemiah Daniels of New London and Otsego County, N.Y. married Elizabeth Malony, not Elizabeth Freeman. The latter individual married Nehemiah Daniels, the son of Nehemiah Daniels of Colchester and Hebron at Hebron, Tolland County, Connecticut on 20 June 1791.^[12]

The identity of Nehemiah's first wife is unknown. According to Alexander E. Daniels, son of Nehemiah and Elizabeth Malony, his father was married to an unnamed first wife and had three daughters. Alexander provides only the names of the daughters from that marriage, indicating that they were born near New London. No further information has been found on these daughters.^[13]

Alexander E. Daniels became a Methodist minister in 1834, served in many different churches and participated in revivals in Chenango and Otsego Counties in N.Y.. In 1893, he was living in Morris, Otsego Co., and writing on religious subjects and occasionally preaching at funerals. Alexander E. Daniels was married three times, but had no children. After the death of his niece, Sarah Jane (Daniels) Niles in 1864, he adopted her daughter, Emma Adelia Niles. He provided much of the family information on the extended families of his father Nehemiah and his grandfather, also named Nehemiah Daniels, included in the *Biographical Sketches of the Leading Citizens of Otsego County, N.Y., 1893*.^[19]

LEONARD⁶ DANIELS, (*Nehemiah⁵⁻⁴, Thomas³, John²⁻¹*), was born in New London, Connecticut, 14 June 1793.^[37] He died in Allegheny County, N.Y., on 21 April 1834,^[38] and was buried in Maple Lawn Cemetery, Bolivar, Allegany County.^[39] He married in 1820 ABIGAIL KELLOGG, who was born in Ridgefield, Connecticut, on 3 January 1802, daughter of Ebenezer and Martha (Northrup) Kellogg,^[40] died 13 September 1847, and was buried in Maple Lawn Cemetery.^[41] Abigail married (2) Clark Millard.^[42]

Leonard Daniels came to Bolivar in the spring or summer of 1830 and sent for his family (who arrived here Oct. 18, 1830), and was a farmer for a year or two and then purchased a sawmill of Leonard & Wellman. This mill was situated on the Kenyon mill site exactly on the line between Little Genesee and Bolivar. The Daniels family (4 boys and 2 girls) lived in a house near the mill. One day in April, 1834, while the son Alexander, 8 years old, was running on the logs in the millpond he fell into the water, his mother hastened

to the place, waded into the water up to her neck and tried to grasp her boy but could not do so. The father, who was about 80 rods away, ran with all his speed, and being an expert swimmer ran out on the booms as near his floating boy as possible, plunged into the water to save first his wife (already being assisted by a man named Mills, who had caught hold of her clothing and sitting astride of a log was slowly but surely carrying her to the shore), Mr. Daniels then turned his attention to his boy who was farther in the pond, and swam again to the boom, raised his hands as if to pull himself upon the boom, when he sank and was drowned, his body not again coming to the surface. At this time Merrill Cowles arrived and assisted in getting Mrs. Daniels out of the water, and then rescued the body of the boy, which, strange to say, had never sunk. It was hard to make Mr. Cowles believe that Mr. Daniels was in the water, but at last he took a pike pole, went to the place where the body sank and succeeded in catching it with the pike pole and hurried it on shore where physicians had arrived but they failed to resuscitate his body.^[43]

John Sylvester Halbert was 37 years old when he was drafted at Williamsport, Pa., on 30 Sept. 1864 into Co. A, 29th Pa. Nehemiah Daniels migrated with his parents to Butternuts, Otsego County, New York, but he moved back and forth between Connecticut and New York. He was of Butternuts when he married Laurindia Thorpe in North Haven in 1817. In the 1830 census, they were living in Windham, Connecticut.^[130] They moved to Vernon, Connecticut, and were admitted to the Vernon First Church on 23 March 1834.^[131] On 5 November 1840, a probate distribution from David Thorpe's estate was made to the heirs of Lorinda Daniels that included 15½ rods of land and a half interest in the remaining half of the dwelling house which was undivided.^[132] Nehemiah was dismissed from the Vernon Church to the Church in Butternuts, on 28 October 1841.^[133] In Morris in the 1850 census the family included Nehemiah age 55, farmer, Lucy 33, Elizabeth 74, and Mary 15, all born in Connecticut, plus John A. 7, Albert W. 3, and Charles A. 1, all born in New York.^[134] Morris was formed out of the Town of Butternuts in April 1849.^[135]

John N. Daniels enlisted on 27 Aug. 1862 and was mustered into Co. C., 152nd N.Y. Volunteer Infantry Regiment on 4 Sept. or 14 Oct. 1862. He was 19 years old, born Morris, with blue eyes, brown hair, light complexion, 5'5" tall and a farmer. John Daniels was captured near Petersburg, Va., on 22 June 1864 and was released on 28 April 1865. He was mustered out in N.Y. City on 29 June 1865.^[180] Although he was briefly held at both Libby and Belle Isle prisons, the majority of his imprisonment was at the notorious Andersonville prison in Andersonville, Ga. After the Civil War ended, John wrote a series of articles about his experience in the *Morris Chronicle*. He died before 1850.^[272]

John Northrup served in the War of 1812, but his exact service record is unknown as at least three individuals of that name served in that war from New York.^[273] The family of John Northrup is enumerated on the same census page as Nancy's father Nehemiah in the 1820 census in Butternuts, New York.^[274] There are three males under ten that correspond with the ages of the three known sons of John and Nancy (Daniels) Northrup. Nancy appears to have been residing with the family of her son, Nelson Northrup at the 1840 census.^[275]

Nelson Northrup was an inventor with a number of patents including one for firing heavy cannons with steam

power. He served as a civilian special dispatch bearer for the Army of the Potomac during the Civil War. Although he was captured once, he was able to escape and return to the Army. His health was broken during his service, suffering exposure during the winter from sleeping on the ground without a blanket for protection after a grueling forty mile march. Nelson developed typhoid fever following this incident and died less than three years after the end of the Civil War.^[277]

Lewis Northrop enlisted in the U.S. Navy under age without his mother's knowledge and became homesick as the ship was assigned to battle Algerine pirates. He disclosed his location to his mother, and she secured his discharge. Lewis later served on a whaler for three years and deserted on the Barbary Coast with another sailor. On 6 Dec. 1839, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, age 22, blue eyes, light hair, light complexion, 5' 5" tall, b. Otsego Co.

He deserted on 26 Dec. 1839 and was apprehended on 15 Jan. 1840.^[292]

19. WILLIAM F.⁶ DANIELS, (*Nehemiah⁵⁻⁴, Thomas³, John²⁻¹*) was born in New London, Connecticut, on 4 July 1801. He died in Morris, Otsego County, New York, on 6 January 1869 and was buried in the Quaker Burying Ground in Morris.^[300] He married about 1826 NANCY ANN HUBBELL, who was born in Connecticut on 16 June 1796, daughter of Lewis and Hannah (Botsford) Hubbell.^[301] She died on 28 August 1867 and was buried with William.^[302]

Nancy Ann (Hubbell) Daniels and her family wrote letters to her niece Adelia Judson from at least 1836 through 1867. Adelia moved from Connecticut to N.Y. and then migrated to Oregon with her brother, Methodist minister, Lewis Hubbell Judson in 1840. Nancy's letters kept Adelia informed about her daughters as they grew up and also the families that Adelia knew from when she was a teacher living in Morris. The letters are informative, as an abstract of a 29 August 1853 letter demonstrates:

...We reside in the town of Morris, formerly Butternuts, Louisville village ... Elizabeth and Charlotte A. live in the factory where you kept school ... their husbands are labourers in the factory ... at present Sarah is a milliner by trade ... not having much employ at this season of year in that business she is at work in the factory boarding with Charlotte L_ tia [*sic.* Lucia] is at housework in Norwich village. Father and Mother Daniels, Mother Moffatt Br Ransom, his oldest daughter Hannah have all died in the faith

of the gospel and gone to their reward ... Gad Stranahans wife, Mr Draper and nearly all the old people in the Hollow are gone that were there when you was there almost an entire new set of inhabitants are there....^[303]

Daniels, wrote to her cousin, Adelia (Judson) Turkington that she had been taught to write and was writing and composing her first letter to Adelia. A postscript was added by her mother, Nancy Ann (Hubbell) Daniels.^[310]

George Thomas Wilson enlisted in Sept. 1862 and was mustered into Co. C., 152nd N.Y. Volunteer Infantry Regiment, on 14 Oct. 1862. He was 32 years old, born Morris, with brown eyes, brown hair, light complexion, 5' 9" tall and a factory operative, residing in Morris. George Thomas Wilson served in General Grant's 1864 campaign from the Wilderness to Petersburg and also participated in the battles of Reems Station and Deep Bottom; he was mustered out on 20 July 1865. His record indicates that he was detached to the ambulance corp. during part of his service.^[311]

Chester Tilden of the First Congregational Church in Willimantic, Windham, Connecticut, 20 June 1830 to EMILY JAMES.^[360] His nephew, Nehemiah Daniels, was a member of the same church and was living in Windham, in the 1830 census.^[361] Enoch was not living in Nehemiah’s household and is not found in that census. Enoch W. Daniels and his wife, Emily were baptized and admitted to the First Congregational Church of Stafford, Connecticut, in November 1841. On 29 November 1850, Enoch and Emily Daniels were dismissed to the newly formed Stafford Springs Congregational Church.^[362] Enoch was head of household in Stafford in the 1840 and 1850 censuses. In 1850 Enoch W. was age 41, manufacturer, with Emily 38, both born in New York, Mary J. born in Rhode Island, and Caroline 11, born in Connecticut.^[363]

He died in Waterford, Connecticut, 7 September 1883 aged 93^[386] and was buried in Jordan Cemetery in Waterford.^[387] He married about July 1823 ALMIRA MOORE,^[388] who was born in Waterford 19 September 1802, daughter of William and Irene Reaney “Jane” (Huntley) (Ryon) Moore, 2nd.^[389] She died in Waterford on 9 November 1865 and was buried in Jordan Cemetery.^[390]

Silas Daniels had service in the War of 1812 in the 3rd Connecticut Militia Regiment commanded by Lieutenant Colonel William Moore, 4th. He served in Captain Amos Crocker’s company from 5 June to 15 June 1813 and in Captain Aaron Douglas’s company from 10 August to 26 August 1814. On 8 June 1878, Silas Daniels, eighty-eight years old and a resident of Waterford testified before the judges of the New London Probate Court about his War of 1812 service in order to obtain a pension.^[391] Silas Daniels was said to be able to jump in the air and strike his feet together twice when he was seventy years old. He liked a good joke even if it was on himself and he was active until the end of his life.^[392]

Justus Silliman in 1790 of Weston, Fairfield County, 2 – 1 – 2 – 0 – 0^[1]

JUSTUS SILLIMAN was born in Weston, Fairfield County, Connecticut, on 5 June 1767 and baptized on 5 July 1767, son of Daniel and Sarah (Burr) Silliman.^[2] He died on 30 April 1839 aged 71 years 10 months and was buried in the Union Cemetery, now in the town of Easton, which was formed from Weston in 1845.^[3] Justus married in Weston on 23 April 1789, **RUTH JENNINGS**.^[4] She was born in Fairfield County on 12 September 1765, daughter of Gershom and Rhoda (Sanford) Jennings.^[5] Ruth died on 20 March 1836 aged 70 years 6 months and was buried next to Justus.^[6] On 7 December 1837, Justus married again; he gave his age as 71, but did not record the name of his wife!^[7]

Like his father before him, Justus was a deacon of the Easton Congregational Church. He left an account book compiled with his son Joseph and entitled “work accounts. records of loans. dowry and gifts 1792–1838.” The writing is sometimes faded. Gifts of \$1000 are listed to his sons and gifts of \$500 to his daughters as well as the births and deaths of some of his children. Most of this account book comprises financial transactions.^[8]

Justus’s mother died 22 February 1773 in her 48th year,^[9] and his father Daniel died three days later, in his 52nd year on 25 February 1773.^[10] On 4 January 1774, Daniel Silliman was appointed guardian of Justus and posted bond.^[11] Presumably this Daniel was Justus’s older brother, who was born on 14 June 1752.^[12] On 19 October 1787, when Justus was 20, Ezra Seeley was appointed Justus’s guardian and posted bond.^[13]

In 1800 there were three males and one female under 10, a male 10–15, and Justus and wife 26–44.^[14] Justus is not indexed in 1810, but he is probably the unindexed Silliman whose given name looks more like “Legar,”^[15] as the count matches his family well, a male and three females under 10, a male and a female 10–15, a male 26–44 (Justus age 43) and a female 45 and over (Ruth age 45). In 1820 in Weston, Justus and a female were 45 and over with a male 18–25, two females 10–15 and one female 16–25.^[16]

Justus made his will on 13 November 1830, naming wife Ruth, daughter Marinda, grandson Alfred S. Platt, his other children “in equal shares,”

and the heirs of son Isaac, having said that to Isaac “I give nothing.” It was proved on 7 June 1839.^[17] Administration on Ruth’s estate was granted to Joseph Silliman on 7 May 1839. Stephen Silliman, Abigail Sherwood, and Raymond Whitney assented. Distribution of land on 2 December 1839 was to Joseph, Isaac, Stephen, Abijah, and Daniel Silliman; Abigail, wife of Isaac Sherwood; and Miranda, wife of “Rayment” Whitney.^[18]

Children of Justus and Ruth (Jennings) Silliman, born in Weston:^[19]

Stephen Silliman of Bridgeport posted bond on Isaac’s estate on 10 July 1840.^[34] A more complete file lists his homestead in Bridgeport and land in Fairfield. On 17 March 1841 the home was distributed as dower to widow Charity. On 20 March 1841 The rest of the real estate was assigned to Polly, wife of William Peck; Catharine, wife of James Sheffield, and Solomon Silliman, a minor, all of the state of New York.^[35]

Salisbury Rural Cemetery, Salisbury, Herkimer Co., N.Y.;^[46] m. 10 Jan. 1819, **CATHERINE SHERWOOD**,^[47] daughter of Daniel and Hulda (Middlebrook) Sherwood, b. Weston^[48] 17 June 1798, d. Herkimer Co. 29 April 1891, bur. with Daniel.^[49] In 1880 Catherine, age 81, was living in Salisbury, mother of Sherwood Silliman, 59, and family.^[50] Daniel is the author’s second great grandfather.

In 1850 in Easton, Abigail “Jordan” was was age 55 [*sic*], living with Justice Sherwood, 27, his wife Margaret, 26, and their son Charles H. 5.^[58]
- Isaac’s widow Abigail Sherwood posted bond on his estate on 7 June 1838 with with William J. Nicholson and Joseph Silliman as sureties. Isaac was “late of Weston.” On 4 Feb. 1839, land was distributed to Harriet, wife of William J. Nicholson, son Silliman Sherwood, and second son Justus Sherwood.^[59]

Eunice (Rowell) Burr in the 1790 Census of Farmington, Connecticut

EUNICE ROWELL, daughter of Daniel and Eunice (Brown) Rowell, was baptized in the Wintonbury Congregational Church in Bloomfield, Connecticut, on 17 October 1742.^[1] She died in Harrisburg, Lewis County, New York, on 27 April 1813 during an epidemic of black erysipelas.^[2] She married at the Wintonbury Church on 10 May 1773, ISAIAH BURR.^[3] He was baptized there on 8 September 1745, son of Nathaniel and Hannah (Loomis) Burr.^[4] He died in Bloomfield on 27 April 1779 in his 34th year^[5] and is buried in the Old Wintonbury Cemetery in Bloomfield.^[6]

In 1790, Eunice was living in Farmington, Connecticut, listed as head of household with two males under 16 and herself, the one female.^[7] At some point after 2 August 1790 (the official census date), she married a man named Woodward, Woodruff, or Woodworth.^[8] There were many Woodruffs in that Farmington census, and one source says her second husband was ___ Woodruff.^[9] It is unknown when she remarried or when she moved to Lewis County, New York. A search of probate and land records in or near Hartford County has not shown any records of inheritance or land ownership of herself or her late husband, nor has a search of the Barbour Collection of Vital Records located her second marriage. Her parents' deaths are recorded in the Wintonbury Church Records, but no probate mentioning Eunice has been found. Her life would have ended in obscurity, if a grandson, Duma Burr, who was only one year old when she died, had not sued his mother and stepfather, Catherine and Grinman Austin, for his inheritance in 1832. These court records provide the only glimpse into Eunice's life after 1790. Testimony during this proceeding gives us her second husband's possible surname and a list of one half of her worldly goods. They detail an arrangement made with her two eldest sons for her support in exchange for her worldly goods after her death. They also give us the date of her death. Her most valuable personal assets appear to be a string of gold beads and her clothing.^[10]

Isaiah and Eunice (Rowell) Burr had four children, three of whom lived to adulthood:^[11]

- i. Child, d. 30 Nov. 1773 aged 2 hours.^[12]
- ii. JOAB BURR, bp. Wintonbury 8 Jan. 1775;^[13] d. Lowville, Lewis Co., N.Y., 10 March 1828;^[14] m. ca. 1796 MARIA or MARIAH ____, b. Saratoga Co., N.Y., ca. 1780,^[15] d. Lowville 7 Feb. 1860.^[16]

In 1800, Joab may have been living in Johnstown, Montgomery Co., N.Y., with his younger brother Hiram.^[17] He was certainly there by 1802 when he paid property tax^[18] It is uncertain when he moved to Lewis Co., but was there in 1807 when he is listed as one of the Census of Electors in Lowville.^[19]

Joab purchased land in Lowville on 28 April 1814 and again on 2 April 1824.^[20] A neighbor George A. Stoddard gave testimony in 1832 that Joab and his brother Hiram had agreed to support their mother Unis Woodworth [*sic*] in exchange for her property after her death.^[21] Joab served in the War of 1812 at Ogdensburg under Capt. Nathan Cook in Col. Thos P. Benedict's regiment from 26 June to 26 Aug. 1812; under Capt. Caleb L. Clark in Lieutenant Col. Zeboan Carter's regiment from 1 to 20 March 1813 and under Capt. Cyrus Trowbridge in Col. Zeboan Carter's regiment from 30 July to 22 Aug. 1814.^[22]

Joab and his wife were members of the Baptist Church in Lowville, where records cover "a meeting of the members of the Lowville and Denmark Baptist Church, living south of and including Moses Waters, held the 8th day of September 1824 at the house of Joab Burr, in the village of Lowville."^[23]

In 1810 their family included one male under 10, one male 10–15, one male 26–44, two females under 10, and one female 26–44.^[24] In 1820 they had one male under 10, one male 10–15, one male 45 and over, two females under 10, two females 16–25, and one female 26–44.^[25] Mariah's dower was set off to her on 24 Sept. 1829.^[26]

Known children of Joab and Maria/Mariah (____) Burr:

1. *Lucinda Burr*, b. Montgomery Co. say 1797; d. after the 1865 census;^[27] m. Lewis Co., *Isaac Wetmore*, b. 1790, d. 1853.^[28] They had eight children.^[29]
2. *Festus Burr*, b. 1799; d. 17 July 1876, bur. Oswego Twp. Cemetery, Oswego, Kendall Co., Ill.^[30] m. about 1820 *Julia Ann Drinkwater*, b. 1804, d. 9 July 1859, bur. with Festus.^[31] They were parents of eight children.^[32] He m. (2) in Kendall Co., Ill., 4 April 1861 *Maria Ann (Wetsel) Brownell*,^[33] b. Schaghticoke Hill, Rensselaer Co., N.Y., 22 Jan. 1810, d. 16 Feb. 1896, bur. Pearce Cemetery, Oswego.^[34] A carpenter and joiner, Festus lived in Canada, was in Porter, Niagara Co., N.Y., in 1840, and moved to Oswego, Ill., prior to 1850.^[35]
3. *Uretta Burr*, b. ca. 1 Feb 1804; d. 6 June 1882 aged 78 years 4 months 5 days, bur. Gardner's Corners Cemetery, Rector, Lewis Co., N.Y.;^[36] m. say 1828^[37] *George*

- Turner*, b. perhaps Onondaga Co., N.Y., ca. 1803 and lived in Martinsburg,^[38] d. before the 1865 census.^[39] They were parents of five children.^[40] In 1875 widow “Euretta” Turner, age 71, was living alone in a log house in Montague, Lewis Co.^[41]
4. ?*George T. Burr*,^[42] b. say 1808.
 5. ?Female child, b. say 1812.^[43]
 6. *Orlando Percival Burr*, b. 9 April 1815; d. 31 Jan. 1877, bur. Riverside Cemetery, Oswego, N.Y.;^[44] m. say 1846 *Melissa Marshall*, b. probably Canada ca. 1820,^[45] evidently d. before the 1855 census. They were parents of two sons.^[46] He m. (2) his first cousin once removed, *Amy Austin Demers*, daughter of Jedediah and Eunice (Burr) Austin, great granddaughter of our subject.^[47]

 8. *Maxmillion Burr*, b. say 1820.^[48]
- iii. **HIRAM BURR**, b. late 1776 or early 1777, bp. Wintonbury as “Irum” 16 Feb. 1777;^[49] d. Harrisburgh, Lewis Co., 15 April 1813;^[50] m. Montgomery Co., N.Y., by 1800, CATHERINE VAN SKUYVER,^[51] b. Johnstown, Fulton Co., N.Y., 28 Aug. 1784, d. 9 Aug. 1872, bur. Austin Cemetery, Denmark, Lewis Co.^[52] She m. (2) Lewis Co., 4 Sept. 1814, Grinman Austin,^[53] b. Richmond, Washington Co., R.I., 29 Oct. 1773,^[54] d. 21 Sept. 1831 aged 61 years 11 months [*sic*], bur. Austin Cemetery.^[55]

Hiram was likely still at home, aged about 13, with his mother in the census of 1790. He had moved to Johnstown, Montgomery Co., N.Y., before 1799 when he was taxed on a house and farm there through 1802.^[56] The logic of him moving to Johnstown is apparent when looking at his neighbors. His paternal uncles Nathaniel Burr and Salem Burr and their families were in the area as early as 1790.^[57] The census of 1800 for Johnstown lists him as head of household.^[58] There is an ink blot in the first column, but the number there has been generally interpreted as three males under 10. The other census columns have two males 16–26 [clearly a 2], one male 26–45, two females under 10, one female 16–26, and one female 26–45. Possibly one of the males 16–26 was Hiram’s brother Joab, and possibly Hiram was not yet married. Joab had a male and a female under 10, so perhaps he was living there, but clearly another older family is included in the count.

Hiram was already “of Harrisburgh,” Lewis Co., by 21 Nov. 1805, when he purchased 40 acres on the east side of the east quarter of Lot 21, Township 10, for \$160.00.^[59] He is listed in the Census of Electors for Harrisburgh in 1807.^[60]

In 1810 Hiram was enumerated in Lewis County with three males and a female under 10, a female 10–15, himself and a female 26–44.^[61] He served in the War of 1812 between 28 Feb. and 13 March 1813 as part of Capt Luke Winchell's company in the 46th regiment of Lt. Col. Richard Coxe. His pay was \$3.46.^[62]

Administration was granted to his wife Katy Burr on 9 June 1813. His inventory at the time of his death was several pages long and included not only household and farming implements but inventory from a sawmill, notes from loans he had made, and five books, totaling \$425.49. Testimony by George A. Stoddard, a neighbor, in the 1832 lawsuit said, "Hiram Burr was an industrious man. I think the children did not labour the first year after the death of Burr."^[63]

Children of Hiram and Catherine (VanSkuyver) Burr:^[64]

- iv. ISAAH BURR, bp. Wintonbury 18 July 1779;^[88] d. Ogdensburg, St. Lawrence Co., N.Y., 6 Nov. 1812 of “Militia Fever”; m. before 1810 POLLY _____. She m. (2) Lewis Gearl.^[89] In 1810 Isaiah was listed next to Hiram in Lewis County, a male with a female 26–45 and a female under 10.^[90] He served in the War of 1812 in Colonel Thomas P. Benedict’s regiment.^[91] They were the parents of two children:^[92]

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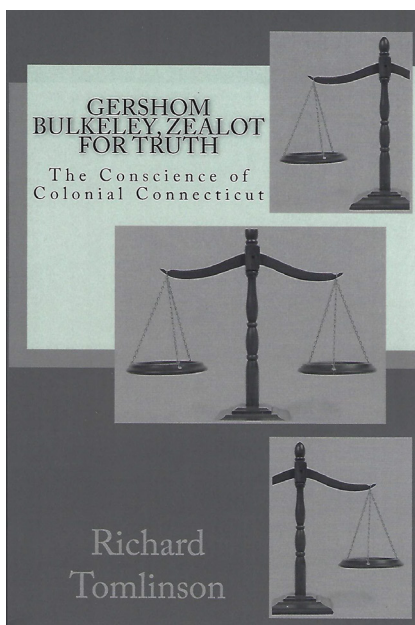
