### Calley sentence reduced to 20 years

PT. WASHINGTON, Ga. (AP) — Lt. William L. Calley Jr.'s life imprisonment sentence for the murder of My Lai was reduced Friday by the presiding general of the 3rd Army to 20 years, making the soldier eligible for parole in seven years. Calley's civilian lawyer said the 38-year-old lieutenant was "very pleased" with the reduction of his sentence. The case now goes to the U.S. Army Court of Military Review in Washington.

Under court order sent to Calley in Calley's behalf, the sentence was reduced to 20 years. The sentence was suspended for 10 months. Calley will not be in the company of My Lai's mother. Calley, shot last time, has been under court order not to make statements to newspaper, and his civilian attorney, George W. Lutzner of Little Rock, talked to Calley by telephone.
