Morris Father Suffers Burns

Brothers Save Twins in Fire

Oeonta — Two children of Mr. and Mrs. Durward Valentine were hailed as heroes yesterday after fire swept their home in Morris.

The boys, William, 13, and Barry, 10, rescued their twin brothers, Ronald and Donald Valentine, from an upstairs bedroom during the early morning blaze.

Despite the flames, the boys were said to have led the twins through a window, over a porch roof, and dropped them to safety.

The father, meanwhile, reportedly suffered burns about the hands when he attempted to reach the second floor to rescue the four boys.

Forced back by the flames, he was said to have escaped

with his wife, another son, Paul, 1½, and a niece, Bonnie Valentine, 3.

The parents, youngest son and niece were occupying rooms on the first floor of the house in High Street when the fire broke out about 2:30 a. m.

Fire Chief Dan Gassler of Morris said the flames are believed to have emanated from an overloaded electrical circuit in the second floor of the house.

He estimated the damage at some \$5,000, some of which reportedly is covered by insurance.

Last night, Mr. and Mrs. Valentine, the children and their niece were staying at the home of her brother, Glenn Hoag in Morris.

In addition to the five youngsters, the Valentines also

have two others, Rene, 19, and Gene, 18, who were not at home when the fire was discovered.
